- 2. Examine the portrayal of God through different passages of text
- 3. Discuss the use of language and its intent

Assigned Readings and/or Websites:

Read Revelations 21:1-4, 6-8

Study Questions and/or Discussions Prompts for Students:

- 1. In Mark 1:10-11, how is God portrayed by the author? What characteristics would the reader attach?
- 2. In Mark 1:12-13, how is God portrayed by the author? What characteristics?
- 3. In Revelations 21:1-4, how is God portrayed by the author? What characteristics?
- 4. In Revelations 21:6-8, how is God portrayed by the author? What characteristics?
- 5. What emotions might a reader feel during each passage? What does the author want the reader to feel?

Written Assignments and/or other Assessment Instruments:

Students complete a journal assignment considering the following questions:

- How is the language used and why might the author choose certain words?
- What is the intent of the writer and how does the writer make that clear?
- Knowing this is a translation of the original text, does that change the interpretation? Why or why not?
