Study Questions and/or Discussions Prompts for Students:

- 1. How does Bollywood examine contemporary Hindu culture without explicitly expounding traditional Hindu teachings?
- 2. What are some of the cinematic methods used that help portray Hindu themes in Bollywood films?
- 3. How do Bollywood released films differ from those in American society?
- 4. Why do you believe cinema has become such a key element of Hindu expression?
- 5. How has Bollywood recently begun to show negative aspects of Hinduism? Why could this be so?
- 6. How has Islam become integrated into the traditionally Hindu culture of Bollywood?

Written Assignments and/or other Assessment Instruments:

Hindu teachings stress the use of theater, dance, music and artistic expression as ways of devotions; how have these ideas been integrated into our contemporary society through the use of cinema? Further, how do you believe other religions and cultures could benefit from such a view point? Watch a "Bollywood" film and write a 2 page paper discussing the Hindu ideas that may be apparently evident and those that may be underlying.
