World Religion: Hinduism Teaching Module Title: The Origins and Early Development of Hinduism

Teaching Module Goals:

1. Introduce students to the basic religious scriptures and the time frame of their origin.

- 2. Examine the cultural and religious environment that led to the spread of Hinduism.
- 3. Familiarize students with the basic historical effects of Hindu philosophy.

Study Questions and/or Discussions Prompts for Students:

- 1. What was the cultural background of the first Hindus?
- 2. What was the political situation at the dawn of Hinduism? Who ruled India?
- 3. What are dharma and karma?
- 4. What are the Upanishads and the Bhagavad-Gita?

Written Assignments and/or other Assessment Instruments:

Come to class with written responses to these questions. We will discuss the answers together and have a brief lecture in preparation for a quiz, which I will give the students after this class session.

Important points to stress in classroom discussion:

- 1. The concept of numerous reincarnations is reflected in the thematic repetitions in the *Bhagavad-Gita* in Arjuna's questions and Krishna's answers.
- 2. Hinduism drew largely, but not exclusively, from the ancient Aryan beliefs, which they brought into India after 1500 B.C.E.
- 3. The class system of India was reinforced by the teachings of Hinduism.
