

## Study Questions and/or Discussions Prompts for Students:

- 1. How did the first wave of Muslims first arrive in North America?
- 2. How did Job Ben Solomon come to the attention of the British aristocracy?
- 3. What does this sensitive portrait painting tell us about the subject and painter?
- 4. At the end of his article on Louis Henry Gates Jr. tells us that upon returning to Senegal in 1734 one of the first things Job Ben Solomon did was to purchase a slave. What does this mean to our story? What does this tell us about the 18<sup>th</sup> Century?
- 5. On pages 95-96 Edward E. Curtis IV shares a reflective piece by Asma Gull Hasan called "Jihad with Granddad." What generational divides are made visible in this personal piece?
- 6.
